SAFETY CONCERNS

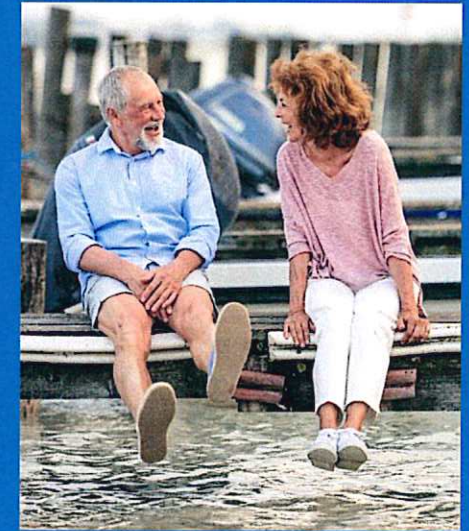
Our hearing care providers are concerned about keeping their patients and staff healthy. Measures some take include:
